Youth Ministry

Overview: Provide assistance to the Student Ministry Leaders during the RESET event to aid the experience of the students in their growing of faith and fellowship.

Description and Responsibilities:

- RESET events aim to provide an excellent faith-filled experience for youth. Examples include:
- Arriving at the RESET event venue 30 minutes prior to the start time to help the Student Ministry Leaders prep for check-in. We aim to be ready 15 minutes before we start in case anyone arrives early.
- Standing at the door greeting each child and their guardian/parent(s).
- Learning each child's name.
- Helping check each student in.
- Handing out any necessary supplies.
- Monitoring the students' conduct.
- Taking pictures and videos for RESET's social media.
- Helping clean up afterwards (i.e. tearing down 9-Square, putting supplies away, throwing away trash, moving trash cans back inside).
- Pray for youth regularly.
- RESET Event Volunteers' consistent presence shows families that RESET is a welcoming and safe environment, that the emotional needs of the child are a priority and that the child can count on the love of a teacher who will lead the child to see, know and feel the love of God.
- RESET Event Volunteers work together with the Student Ministry Leaders to build a team of people who work in an effort to appropriately support a successful and excellent learning environment within that event.
- RESET Event Volunteers are informed of any special victories, concerns or challenges being faced by the children and their families and, as often as reasonable, pass that information on to the Graduate Resident of Student Ministry overseeing the youth ministry.
- RESET Event Volunteers have gone through the background check and volunteer training process and are adhering to the Safe Sanctuary policy of Asbury UMC.

Outside the monthly RESET Event:

- As time allows, invest in connecting with youth outside of the RESET event. Options include:
 - Attending 945.
 - Attending trips and retreats.
 - Attending student events (games, meets, ceremonies).
 - Attending weekly Wednesday night Life Group events.
 - Attending monthly UNITED events
 - Other creative means of building friendships with the youth and their parents have been sought.
