A LETTER FROM MIKE

What does Easter mean to you? For me, the Resurrection of Jesus Christ offers real hope—not just for the future, but for today. Easter celebrates the heart of our faith: that through Christ’s victory over death, God’s grace reaches into every corner of human experience. John Wesley taught that this same resurrection power works in us still—awakening us to God’s love, assuring us of our salvation, and transforming us day by day into the people God created us to be.

Easter also calls us outward. Because Christ is risen, we are sent to share that hope with a hurting world through acts of mercy, justice, and compassion. After His Resurrection, Jesus gives his disciples the Great Commission found in Matthew 28 telling them to go and teach and baptize others.

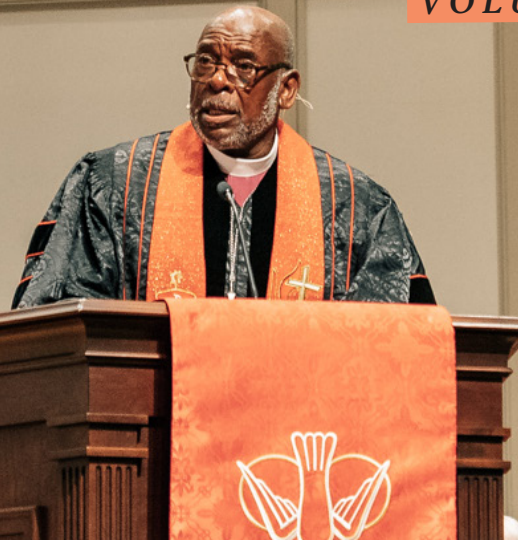

sparkling joy

Each summer, Asbury United Methodist Church comes alive with laughter, music, and discovery during Vacation Bible School. From June 22-25, 2026, Asbury will transform into Camp Spark, an imaginative four-day adventure during which around 400 children will explore how God sparks trust, joy, wisdom, and peace in our lives. Children will hear meaningful Bible stories that highlight how God's presence sparks goodness in the world and in our everyday lives. These stories, along with music, dancing, hands-on activities, and more will help kids connect with their faith and each other in fun and memorable ways.

Kids aren't the only ones leaving VBS inspired and renewed, though. Nothing would happen at Asbury without our incredible volunteers, least of all Vacation Bible School. Dozens of volunteers come together every year to transform the campus, lead activities, dance, sing, and pray throughout the VBS experience.

We spoke with veteran volunteer Angel McPhearson, whose love for Asbury and the people here shines in all she does, to learn about the impact VBS has on not only the children who participate, but also the adults and students that make it all happen. Thank you, Angel, for your time and willingness to share!



How long have you been involved with Asbury? With VBS?

Angel: I became a member in the fall of 1992 when Asbury was located on the other side of [Highway] 119. I got involved almost right away after meeting Sandy Jackson; she's still one of my closest Asbury friends to this day. I remember that my late husband, Greg, and I joined a couples Sunday school class that met in the kitchen and soon we also started helping with the assimilation committee (which welcomed new members with calls and home visits). I began helping with VBS about 19 years ago, shortly after I quit my full-time job after the birth of my third child to stay home with my kids.

What is your role this year?

Angel: My role has always been as a group leader and I really enjoy it as I get to experience all the fun rotations of VBS along with the kids.

Did you grow up going to camp? If so, what was your favorite part or activity?

Angel: I grew up Catholic but went to a Protestant camp in the summer at Camp Chula Vista called Christian Endeavor. It was a week-long camp and I loved making friends, doing activities like swimming and crafts, and the mountain high faith experiences I had there—especially at the Saturday night closing bonfire.

What is your fondest memory associated with VBS either as a volunteer or an attendee?

Angel: My favorite part of VBS was loading up a carload of kids in my van—neighbors, my kids, and my nieces and nephews—to attend VBS (first as participants and later as helpers/leaders). Most of them have grown up now and are no longer available to help out anymore but we have a lot of fond memories of serving at VBS together. My youngest son, Adam, who is 17, has been coming to VBS every summer since he was a baby and this could be his last year to serve since he will be headed to college in the fall. So it's a bitter-sweet one for me.

What is your “spark” and how does it fuel your faith?

Angel: That's a good question and I'm not sure I'd be the best person to answer that. But I do love serving people and encouraging them along the way. And my belief is that participating in VBS plants seeds inside of all of us that can grow deep roots and produce fruits of love, hope, and joy.

Finally, what is your favorite s'mores add-on?

Angel: I think toffee bits would be great in a s'mores!

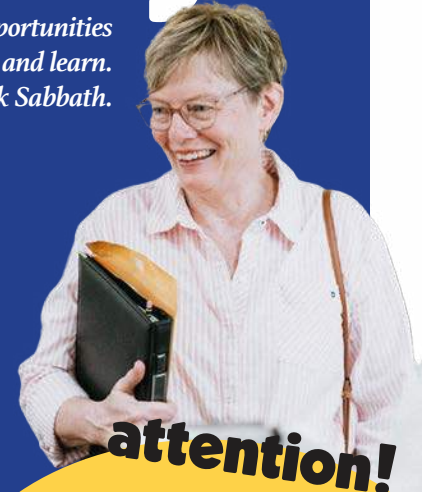

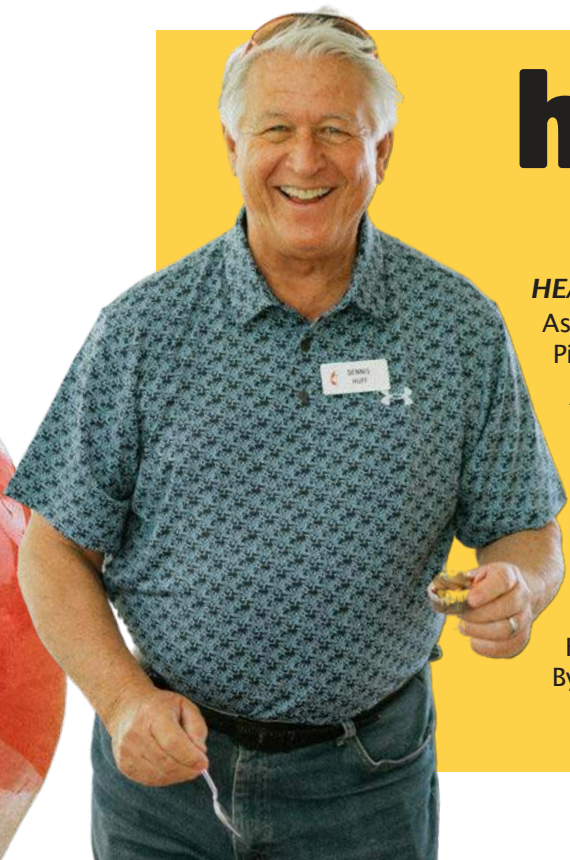

The memory-loss program gives care partners a break each week to run errands, visit with friends, and rest.
